Arts and Crafts

As part of our ongoing art program, this session we focused on fostering creativity through elements that might initially seem messy or complicated. With the changing weather, we recognize that the onset of depression can make it challenging for residents to stay motivated to participate in activities. In response, Liandy's program was designed to create a social space where residents could engage all five senses, making the process of arts and crafts more meaningful and immersive. The program emphasized collaboration and the fusion of creative ideas among neighbors, allowing everyone to contribute to a shared artistic experience. This approach encouraged deep thinking, exploration of abstract design, and the development of new artistic skills.

Residents created abstract collages inspired by Salvador Dalí, painted pumpkins with glitter and tempera, and used their crafts to decorate the front lobby. They also baked intricate cookie designs, created beautiful centerpieces, and prepared traditional holiday treats from various parts of the world. These activities transported participants to different cultural settings, offering them a more profound, sensory-driven experience that not only sparked creativity but also promoted a sense of community and connection.
